June started with visits to Lulworth Cove, Moreton and Yetminster scheduled but no one wanted to do the short ride so we went to Hardy's Cottage instead. One group had a couple of nasty experiences on the way to Lulworth Cove. One with an angry snake just after climbing the Bailey ridge and a deer brought down two of our riders later in the ride, in an incident that resulted in Dave Carter breaking his wrist.

On June 9th the destinations were Chilton Polden for the Medium ride and North Curry for the Short ride. and it was a nice morning out.

On June 16th there were no takers for the short ride to Broadwindsor so we all went to West Bay, where Karen Hawkins found us a charming, if quite expensive, cafe and kept us enthralled by tales of her experiences in the Belfast Police Force and Royal Navy.

Thinking I had missed them there, I pressed on to Chard but no sign of them so I continued to Colyton Station, where the lady in charge said they weren't expected until after 12pm. It was 11.15, so I had a cup of coffee and a slice of fruit cake and made my way home.
